MARRIAGES

Transcript from the Family Record in the Family Bible of the Father of C. E. Brame now in the hands of his brother James of Montgomery, Alabama. (Until his death record, all this record is in the handwriting of C. E. Brame. Later writing is that of his daughter, Udine Brame Spinks and his granddaughter, Mary Spinks Stephens, then later descendants.)

On the day of January 6th 1807 was married by the Rev. Henry Yancey, Samuel Chiles Brame to Miss Betsy C. Yancey, both of the county of Mecklenburg, Virginia.

On the day of in Montgomery, Ala., George Whitman of Rhode Island to Harriet S. oldest daughter of Sam'l C. and Betsey Brame.

On the day of 18 William T. Brame to Señora Mayhew both of Montg'y Ala. On the 4th day of April 1839 James T. Brame to Miss Margery Lee both of Montg'y Ala.

Charles Edward Brame and Mary Frances Brown Webb were married by the Rev. Levert in Perry County, Ala. on the 13th day of December 1849 and removed to Sumter in Sept. 1850.

Elder C. E. Brame and Miss Emily C. Hand were married in Kemper Co., Miss. by Elder C. Gay on the 21st of October A.D. 1877.

Albert Hunter Spinks and Udine Brame were married by the Rev. R. Duncan in Kemper Co., Miss. on the 15th of Aug. 1882.

Margaret "Naggie" Spinks and Vernon C. Wilkerson were married by the Rev. Eugene Stephens, Kemper Co., Miss on the 30th day of May 1922.

Peter Edward Spinks and Harriet M. Jones were married by Rev. King (Calvary Baptist Church in Jackson, Miss. on the 17th of Sept. 1924.

Albert Grady Spinks and Helen Fox were married by Rev. Clingman, Birmingham, Ala., on the 23rd of Dec. 1926.

Mary Frances Spinks and Brice Mayfield Stephens were married by The Rev. Blasing Vaughn in Kemper Co., Miss. on th 10th of Nov. 1927.

Mary Frances Wilkerson, daughter of Margaret and Vernon C. Wilkerson, was married to Robert A. Kettle of Chicago, on January 7, 1944 in the First Congregational Church of Gary, Indiana by pastor, Rev. Merrill Beale.

Albert Hunter Spinks II and Mary Hilma Wilson were married July 31, 1955 in Winona, Miss.

On the 17th day of Dec'r 1811, William Thornton, son of Samuel C. Brame and Betsy his wife.

On the 22nd of Feb'y 1814, Thomas Washington, son of Samuel C. Brame and Betsy his wife.

On the 17 of June 1816, Edwin La Fayette, son of Sammel C. Brame and Betsy his wife.

On the 26th of June 1818, James Yancey Brame of same parents.

On the 14th day of November 1820, was born Samuel C. Brame of same parents. Charles Edward, son of Samuel C. Brame and his wife Elizabeth Yancey, was born in Petersburg, Va., on the 15th day of January 1823--lost his mother in infancy at the age of eight months, and was fatherless before he was seven years of age.

Mary Frances Brown Webb, wife of Charles E. Brame was born in Perry county, Alabama, on the 24th February, 1823, and is the daughter of Thomas Webb and Martha Dickens his wife, both natives of North Carolina.

Thomas Webb Brame, son of Charles E. and Mary F. Brame was born in Perry County, Ala. October 18th 1850.

Harriett Lucretia, daughter of C. E. Brame and Mary, his wife, was born in Perry County, August 17th 1852.

Charles Edward, son of C. E. Brame and Mary, his wife, was born near Livingston in Sumter, County, Ala. on the 16th July, 1855.

William Yancey, son of C. E. Brame and Mary, his wife, was born in Greensboro, Green Co., Ala. on the 27th of May 1858.

The fourth pledge of affection-the third son. Three boys now constitute our family on earth. God grant that they may be a stay and a prop to their parents and each other, "United we stand, divided we fall".

Undine Brame, daughter of C. E. Brame and Mary his wife, was born in the town of Newberne in Greene Co., A.s., on the tenth of January, Eighteen Hundred and Sixty Three (1863).

Milton Hand Brame son of C. E. Brame and Emma his wife, was born in Kemper County Mississippi on the 19th of February 1879.

Ruth Spinks, daughter of A. H. Spinks and Undine Spinks was born in Kemper Co., Miss. on the 28th day of May 1883.

Mary Frances Spinks, daughter of A. H. and Undine Spinks was born in Kemper Co., Miss., on the 6th of August 1885.

Peter Edward Spinks son of A. H. and Undine Spinks was born in Kemper Co., Miss., on the 31st of Dec. 1887.

Albert Grady Spinks son of A. H. and Undine Spinks was born in Kemper Co., Miss., May the 5th 1890.

Maggie Spinks daughter of A. H. and Undine Spinks was born in Kemper Co., Miss. on 1st of Jan'y 1893.

A. H. Spinks, son of P. E. and M. E. Spinks was born in Kemper Co. Miss., on the 6th of March 1851.

Raleigh DeWitt Spinks son of A. H. and Undine Spinks, was born in Kemper Co., Miss., on November eleventh, 1901.

Priscilla Spinks, daughter of Peter Edward and Harriet Spinks was born in Memphis, Tenn. Dec. 10, 1926.

Albert Hunter Spinks, son of Albert Grady and Helen Spinks was born on the 7th of May 1930 in Memphis, Tenn.

Francis Fox Spinks son of Albert Grady and Helen Spinks was born on the 15th of Aug. 1935 at Laurel, Miss.

Carolyn Christine "Ceci" Kettle, daughter of Mary F. Wilkerson Kettle and Robert A. Kettle, was born October 15, 1949 in Detroit, Michigan.

Stephen Hunter Spinks, son of Albert Hunter Spinks II and Mary Hilma Wilson Spinks, was born January 6, 1957 in Greenville, Miss.

Laurie Lynn Spinks daughter of Albert Hunter Spinks II and Mary Hilma Wilson Spinks was born November 12, 1959 in Columbus, Miss.

DEATHS

Departed this life on Friday the 12th day of September 1823 in the town of Petersburg Virginia Mrs. Elizabeth C. Brame Wife of Sam'l C. Brame.

Departed this life on Saturday the 3rd of October 1829 in Autauga County Alabama at the house of Maj. Walter Frazier near Independence, Samuel Giles Brame.

Departed this life the 2nd day of August 1811, Benjamin LaFayette Brame.

Samuel C. Brame son of Samuel C. Brame and Petsy his wife died at the age of eleven years in Autauga County while at school and was buried in the private graveyard of Gen. Elmore.

Ma. T. Brame "our oldest Brother who arrived at manhood and our second Father", died in New Orleans of Bronchitis at the house of George Whitman about the year 1838 and is buried in Montgomery near his wife Signore Mayhew.

Thomas Washington son of Samuel C. Brame and Petsy his wife died at Sumterville Ala. on the 18th May 1852 of neuralgia.

Died near Covington La. Mrs. Harriet P. Whitman, our only sister on the 22nd Sept. 1852.

Harriet Lucretia Brame departed this life in Livingston on the 25th day of Nov. 1855 aged three years 3 months and eight days.

Charles Edward Brame Jr., son of C. E. and Mary F. Brame departed this life in West Point Miss. on the 9th day of September, 1872, aged 17 years, 1 month and 24 days.

William Yancey Brame, son of S. A. Brame and Mary F. Brame departed this life in West Point Miss., on the day of October 1873 Aged 15 years.

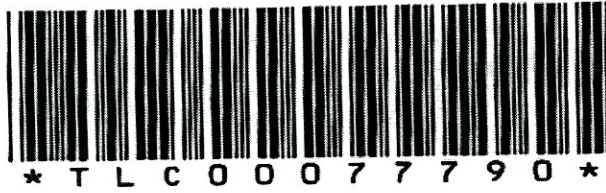
Mary Frances Webb Brame wife of C. E. Brame departed this life after fifteen hours of illness being stricken down with vertigo and paralysis, followed by convulsions on the 6th day of November 1875, at Whitefield, Oktibbeha County Miss. "The righteous hath hope in death";

Departed this life on June 20, 1892 in his home in Kemper County, Miss., Charles Edward Brame, a great teacher and a preacher and a builder of Character, who loved the "Master Builder" supremely. "Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his saints."

Undine Brame Spinks, wife of A. U. Spinks departed this life in Bailey, Miss. on the 11th day of June, 1934.

Raleigh DeWitt Spinks, son of A. U. and Undine Spinks departed this life in Baptist Hospital, Memphis, Tenn., on the 12th day of Nov. 1928.

Albert Hunter Spinks departed this life June 17, 1951 in Meridian, Miss. at the age of 94.
