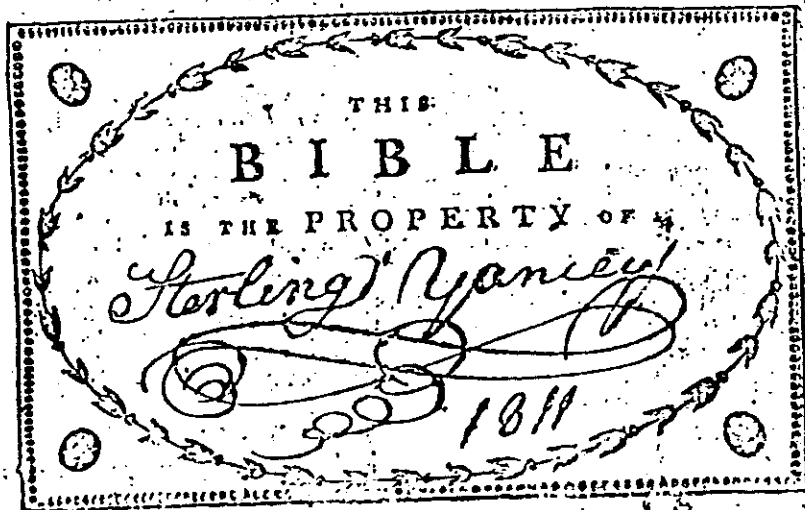

Submitted by Mrs. C. C. James, Rt. #2, Humboldt, Tenn. 38343, who is the owner of this very old Bible. The Bible's Family Records are in several handwritings, some rather difficult to read. Some names were recorded twice but are copied each time. The Bible is very old, fragile, stained, with some holes.

Memorandum for Mrs. C.C. James

Subject: Comments on the Jackson M. Yancey entry in the Sterling Yancey Bible Records, and other items.

1. I agree that your tracing of the torn date reveals "--91;" while 1791 is the date given in JUNY's own Bible.

2. I thought that the handwriting in the JMY entry in the Sterling Yancey Bible reminded me of the entries in his own Bible. So I got out my photocopies - I keep the small Bible in my bank box - and the two entries as to his birth date are so much alike in both Bibles - in addition to the name, note the way Oct 3^d is written in both entries - (that they surely must have been written by the same hand.) What I think happened was that JMY was visiting Sterling Yancey or in the house of a member of the family having the Bible and on looking at the Bible was asked to enter his own name and birth date. (This was after 29 Dec 1803 and before 19 Oct 1830 and may well have been after Sterling's death in January, 1815. And it was not until 25 Mar 1819 that JMY married my great grandmother, Elizabeth B. Goode. (It has been thought that JMY married earlier a Miss Bradford, but no documentation of any earlier marriage has been noted.)

3. That son of Tamy?(or James?) in the JMY entry still confuses me. I have never encountered a man's nickname, such as "Tom(m)y" or "Jamey" or "Jim" in old Bible records or official records; although the girl's name often were so used; e.g., "Polly" for Mary; "Petsy" or "Eliza" for Elizabeth; "Patty" and "Mattie" for Martha; "Prissy" for Pricilla, etc.

The first entry in the right hand column on the same page is clearly James, the "es" shaped much like "y;" but the end letter of "son of T(or)amy" is the other two "y's" in that entry; though a little shorter and very slightly curved to the left. So just now I have no conclusion as what the name is.

4. The Xerox copies certainly are clearer than the photocopies. I only suggested the latter because I thought Humboldt might have a photographer, but not a Xerox machine.

5. It is true that in 1960 I compiled SOME YANCEY NOTES ("Notes for Beginning etc.") at the request of Mr. and Mrs. Jack E. Yancey, who live in Granville County, N.C., but whose post office is across the state line in Buffalo Junction, Virginia (Mecklenburg County, Va.) They are both descendants of Richard Yancey of Mecklenburg Co., Va. and live on land that has been in Yancey or Yancey-kin hands since 1762. They have two fine sons.

6. In 1962 I published a small book, The Descendants of Jackson M. Yancey and Elizabeth B. Goode, His Wife. I still don't know who JMY's father was; but I know a very considerable amount about the Goodes and have three copies of G. Brown Goode's Virginia Cousins, 1887. When I manage to get printed some additions and corrections for my book, I shall be happy to send you a copy. (I have never tried to sell anything; and I have refused to accept offers for SOME YANCEY NOTES, my Yancey-Goode book, and my booklet, The Descendants of John Garrison of Sumner County, Tennessee. John Garrison was also my great grandfather. I do not know his father's name though I believe others do. I have not had time to work on that for many a day.)
