



The Kneer Homestead

he Knerr homestead was on Heatherdowns Blvd. and Key Street. It was a triangular piece of ground now occupied by a hot dog restaurant, apartments and more. Across the street was the main homestead where the bank is now, and St. Patrick's of Heatherdowns grade school.

Emma and Louise Knerr lived in the home until their death in the 1950s. The picture shows the homestead during the auction in the 1950s.

Mygrandfather, Henry Knerr, lived in the home at the point of the triangle and operated a gas station on the property fronting on Heatherdowns Blvd. He was constantly being robbed and once was actually kidnapped. When I was a child, Henry's children took turns spending nights at the gas station with shotguns, trying to catch the burglars.

Grandpa had an old pop cooler which he sold soda pop from. Many times the children were treated. He

taught every one of us how to play cards as soon as we were able to distinguish the suits from each other. He loved to play euchre and pinochle. After a stroke made it physically impossible for him to hold the cards, his son, Leroy, built a wooden holder to go across his lap. Grandpa would bid with a shake of his head to a helper by his bedside.

My mouth waters when I think of his homemade hot pickles and Liverwurst. Grandpa loved to make buckwheat pancakes and melt down the Liverwurst to use instead of syrup. Many a sandwich was made from the Liverwurst in the jellied stage. I've tried many meat markets in the greater Toledo area trying to locate one that made such good Liverwurst, but to no avail.

Next time you go to the Stranahan Theater (formerly Masonic) you can look at this snapshot and remember how it used to be at that busy intersection.


