# Notes for BENEDICHT KNOERR:

The first known member of our Knerr ancestors, Benedicht Knoerr, was born in Switzerland. He fathered Hans Knoerr, who fathered Theodor Knoerr. Theodor was born in Neningkofen, Switzerland, c. 1618. He apparently left Switzerland and went to Germany c. 1648. Theodor spent a short time in Kandel, then settled permanently (1657) in the village of Winzeln, located near the city of Pirmasens in the Palatinate region. Much of the information on Theodor Knerr and his children came from the Pirmasens Sippenbuch, and painstakingly compiled by Walter Wittmer. Theodor was married twice, the name of his first wife is unknown. They had five children:

# Notes for CHRISTINA (KNOERR) KNERR:

Editor: I have some more research dated January 28, 2005. I have just pulled up a Theodor Knerr DOB 1618 in Venckhoven, Berne, Switzerland and DOD: 24 February 1688 in Winzeln, Pirmasens, Germany. That research site shows Christina Knor as his Mother.

This site, also, lists a Christina Stuber DOB: 1595 DOD: 26 April 1674 in Winzeln, Rheinland Pfalz, Germany. Her spouse is listed as: Hans Knoerr DOB: 23 January 1586 in Oberwill Bei Bueren, Switzerland. Parents of this Hans Knoerr is listed as Benedicht Knoerr DOB: 1557 in Bibern, Canton Bern, Switzerland. It lists his spouse as Anna Wyes DOB: 1559. This is the oldest DOB of anyone that I see even on Ancestry.com.

THEODOR (KNOERR)<sup>3</sup> KNERR (HANS<sup>2</sup> KNOERR, BENEDICHT<sup>1</sup>)<sup>2</sup> was born 1618 in Nennigkofen, Canton Solothum, Switzerland, and died 24 Feb 1687/88 in Winzeln, Pirmasens, Pfalz-Bayern, Germany. He married (1) UNKNOWN Abt. 1640. He was born Abt. 1620. He married (2) AGNES KNERR Abt. 1650 in Hornbach, PfalzBayern, Germany. She was born 1630, and died 07 Sep 1708 in Winzeln, Pirmasens, PfalzBayern, Germany.

Notes for THEODOR (KNOERR) KNERR:

First known member of our Knerr ancestors, Theodor Knoerr, was born in Neningkofen, Switzerland c. 1618. He apparently left Switzerland and came to Germany c. 1648. That date marked the conclusion of the Thirty Years War in which it was estimated that two-thirds of the male population of Germany died. Good land was suddenly available for the younger sons of landed families who would never have the opportunity to get it because of the medieval custom of primogeniture which was in force at that time.

Theodor spent a short time in Kandel, before deciding to settle permanently (1657) in the village of Winzeln, located near the city of Pirmasens in the Palatinate region. He appears to have had two wives, each of whom bore him children. The second wife was named Agnes, but we do not know her maiden name. The name of the first wife escapes us entirely.

The date of Theodor's death as well as much of the information we have about him and his descendants comes from the Pirmasens Sippenbuch which has been painstakingly compiled by Herr Walter Wittmer. The death date itself seems strange because three of his sons are listed as being married on that very same day.

In religion, Theodor was listed as Reformiet. Identifying him with the Reformation period of time. We do not know what his occupation happened to be. We believe that he was related to the other Knoerr family which lived in Kandel, but we have no proof of this relationship. Furthermore, we are not positive that we have a complete list of Theodor's children. We have a feeling that he had more daughters than we have found listed. We also would like to know if the Johann Leonhard Knoerr who was married at Pirmasens in 1643 is Theodor's brother.

The old records at Solothurn have been pursued, but we have found none that go back as far as 1618 that would give us a clue to Theodor's forebears. In a letter from Herr Adolf Rothhaar dated 4 Aug. 1991, he states: "Died 26 April 1674 in Winzeln, 70 years old, Christina Knerr (Knoerr), the mother of Theodor Knerr". This could mean that Theodor's father also migrated to Winzeln, but it is possible that she only joined Theodor after the death of her husband back in Switzerland. If her age was recorded correctly, and this was not always the case, she would only have been fourteen years old when she had Theodor. If that is true, it leads one to speculate as to whether Christina was a single parent. We know for a fact that there were Knoerr families in Annweiler as early as 1597 when Anna Knoerr married Lorentz Hausen there. There was also an Elias Knoerr who married Margaretha Welmtz at nearby Landau in 1603 and a Leonhard Knoerr who married Sabina Boegner at Seinsheim in 1612. We have no idea whether any of these people were relatives or not. (Editorial Note: Since 1994 researchers in Germany are now giving Hans Knoerr as Theodor's father and Hans' father is given as Benedict Knoerr of Switzerland. Another item to note is that if Christina died in 1674 at the age of 70, then her year of birth would have been 1604 as stated by most researchers. But, for those who give her date of birth as 1595, she would have been older than 14 when giving birth to Theodor.)

There is a marvelous genie society in Pirmasens, Germany. Their Internet WWW. site is in English, French, and German. They have an index (by surname) page dedicated to Palatines who left Germany for the United States. What is really amazing is that under the letter "K" they have a page dedicated to "Knerr". # Notes for JOHANN MICHAEL KNERR:

Johann Michael Knerr did not marry until he was 36 years old unless an earlier marriage was missed. The Pirmasens Sippenbuch does not list an occupation. He lived in Lemberg (Sipp., p. 432) where he died after being married for only 14 months. Neither of his sons were old enough when he died to remember him. His widow, who was 32 years old when he died, then married Marcus Kuntz. (See Sipp. p.477), for her Kuntz children

One point of conflict is that the Sippenbuch lists his age at death as 31. This would put his birth date at 1661 instead of 1655. We believe he was 37 and that the error came from the transcriber mistakenly reading the "7" as a "1", not an uncommon error, certainly.

### Notes for JOHANN HEINRICH KNERR:

Johann Heinrich lived at Donsieders in 1685. According to descendant and family researcher, Dorothea Saavedra of Bowie, MD., he was born in Gersbach in 1656. He is found on p. 429 of the Pirmasens, Sippenbuch where his residence is listed as Gersbach.

We do know that his wife was 20 years of age when they married at Pirmasens in 1682. They were married for almost thirteen years before Heinrich died, but we have record of only two children being born to them. Could there have been others that did not find their way into the Sippenbuch? Anna Barbara Faul Knerr was only 33 when her husband died and she then married Johann Kaspar Weber of Pirmasens seven and a half months later. Her sons were only 3 and 10 at that time. Both of them went on to become weavers at Gersbach and Donsieders. Anna Barbara's Weber descendants are listed on p. 926 of the Sippenbuch.

### Notes for JOHANN DANIEL KNERR:

Johann Daniel Knerr's birth record has not been found, even though some of his family record was printed in the Sippenbuch (p. 427). We don't know where or when he was born or when he died. Neither do we know his occupation. It seems likely that we have a complete list of his children. Daniel's first wife died at age 50

in 1712. Daughter Anna Maria was only eleven years old at that time. We know that Daniel remarried in 1719 at the approximate age of 61, but we do not know how long he lived after that as no death record has been located.

Notes for EBERHARD GABRIEL KNERR:

Eberhard Gabriel Knerr was a customs official and church warden at the Reformed Church in Winzeln. He and his wife were married 33 years and yet we have record of only three children (Sippenbuch, p. 427). The last child was born when he was 33 and she was 30. Perhaps, there were others of whom we are unaware. We have no birth record other than he died at age 60.

Notes for JOHANN NIKOLAUS (KNOERR) KNERR:

Johann Nikolaus Knerr was born in Switzerland and made the journey to Germany as a young child. His religion was Reformed. He was a GM at Walshausen and obviously a man of substance, but we do not know his occupation. He arrived in Walshausen near Pirmasens before 1672, was at Goellhelm in 1680, and at Nunschwiler in 1685. The last record we have of him is in 1697. No date of death, birth or marriage date has been located for him or his wife. They were married about 1679 in Hornbach. Most of the information on Johann Nikolaus was provided by Herr Adolph Rothhaar of Pirmasens. Neither Nikolaus nor his descendants were given a mention in the Sippenbuch. Herr Wittmer only dealt with Theodor's German-born children and not

the family he brought with him from Switzerland.

### Notes for JOHANN GEORG KNERR:

Johann Georg Knerr's record is not in Wittmer's Sippenbuch. He was a carpenter at Bann and Hoehoinoid. He was confirmed in 1697. An earlier record lists him as a farmer at Walshausen and Kleinsteinhausen. The sources are Herr Adolph Rothhaar and the IGF microfilmed data at Salt Lake City, UT.

We do not know how long Johann Georg lived. The last record we have is 1735 when his last known child was born. He was about 53 years of age at that time. There is a strong possibility that we do not have a complete list of his children.

From the book, Guss Lines, Page 262: "Henry's will, written 26 July1804 and filed 1 May 1806 was contested by his son Henry, Jr., who was not mentioned in it, although the estate was to be "equally divided amongst all my children". The will judged to be valid 27 May 1808. Heinrich (Henry) had arrived on 26 Sept. 1752 in the port

of Philadelphia, a passenger on the ship Richard and Mary. Because he had not been able to pay for his passage, he was indentured for a number of years to pay his debt, in the service of Conrad Seiner of Chester County. In spite of his early financial handicap, Henry prospered, as is indicated in tax lists of 1771, 1780, 1781, 1785 (Pennsylvania, Chester County, Vincent Township) and in the inventory of his estate dated 24 Oct. 1807, which totaled 799 pounds, 7 shillings and 10 pence. Henry was an active participant and generous benefactor in the Lutheran Church, at St. Peter's German Lutheran and at Zion Churches, both in Pikeland Township. Henry served in the Revolutionary War as a private in the Second Batallion of the Chester County Militia, Commanded by Lt. Col. Thomas Bull. His son, Henry, Jr., also as a private in Capt. Hoalman's company.

Notes for GEORG JACOB KNARR:

Supposedly Georg and Catherine were cousins, hence the same surname of Knerr. This was not uncommon in those days.

John Knerr, the father of Darla Corinne Knerr, told her that his Grandparents came from Alsace/Loraine, section of Germany. Therefore they spoke the German language. John spoke in this language at times when his children were small, but his children never learned to speak it. Today that area is in France. The Alsace/Loraine area has at different times been claimed by Germany and France. After the WW I ended in 1917 the area was given to France to control. Prior to that period of history it was controlled by Germany.

My understanding is that this area has gone back and forth between these two countries several times during it's history. Today Salzburg is the capital of the area.

Georg Jacob and Kathrine Knerr/Knarr are both buried in the Riverside Cemetery, Maumee, Lucas Co., Ohio. Their headstones were washed away in the river flooding and never found. The bones of many persons buried there were also washed up and in the Spring they were all buried in a common grave at the North end of the Cemetery.

Notes for FRANK (OEDY) EDDY, SR.:

Frank Eddy (Oedy) lived with his wife, Charlotte Knerr, along the canal where the long boats plied back and forth between Peking Mill and points south and west. Frank was born in Baden Germany in 1823 and chose to come to America armed with his shoemaker pride and the old wooden trunk carrying all his possessions. This trunk is now preserved by his great grandson, Jim Babcock. The journey over the Atlantic took six weeks which wasn't too unusual for a sailing vessel of those days. The shoemaker shop was founded on Farnsworth Road, just a block east of the canal and not more than two and a half blocks from their small stucco home. A son, Frank, Jr., a daughter May Ann (m. Harry F. Witte), and a third child, Joseph, was their family. Their real property was valued at \$800 in 1860, with their personal estate being \$100.

Frank Eddy was a shoemaker and his residence still stands on S. 5th. Street, Waterville; occupied, 1978 by Edward Downard. He also owned Lot 83 in Waterville (bought May 1, 1859 and sold January 29, 1881 to J.W. Rupp. Source: Lucas County Land Records). Lot # 83 is now 209 Farnsworth Road, the first building W. of "Peddler's Alley" (formerly Graf's Garage). It is likely this was the location of his shoemaker's shop and he may have built the building (now Maumee Valley Kitchens) for this section is somewhat older than the house now attached to it. This building was later the location of John W. Rupp's first drug store before Mr. Rupp removed to Toledo and founded the "Rupp and Bowman Drug Co.".

The rest of Frank Eddy's family retained the name of Oede (Oedy), and removed to the Hamler, Ohio area. However, there is a tombstone in the older section of Wakeman Cemetery, for a Joseph Oeda, who died on 18 July 1854, age 29 yars, thus this birth c. 1825, and would have been a contemporary of Frank, but this is only a supposition. (Madge Campbell ~ 1978)

# Marriage Notes for JACOB KNERR and BELINDA UNKNOWN:

Belinda must have immigrated to the U.S. sometime in her late teens. Probably with her parents. She must have married Jacob Knerr about 1859, since she gave birth to their son William Knerr in June of 1860. He must have been born in Toledo, Lucas Co., OH, but so far we have no record of him other than his name and birthdate. Since his father must have immigrated from Germany to Ohio when he was about 19 years of age, as evidenced by his filing a Declaration of Intent to become a U.S. citizen on January 30, 1857. Based on the above information I am assuming that William was born in Toledo, OH and not in Switzerland as his mother was. His mother must have died after his birth in 1860, as there is no further record of her and Jacob remarried in 1863 to his second wife; Catherine A. Allion. Did Jacob and Catherine raise William along with their 7 children?

Probably not as no documentation can be found to support this.

# Notes for CATHERINE A. ALLION:

Catherine is buried in the Knerr family plot in the Wakeman Cemetery located at Waterville, Lucas Co., Ohio. She is buried beside of her husband, Jacob Knerr, and four of their children.

There is a second headstone, of granite that is grey in color, with the name of Catherine Allion and the dates of 1838 - 1908 inscribed upon it. It is also in the Wakeman Cemetery and is located along the outside edge of the cemetery a short distance from the Heirich Knarr family plot.

I have no idea who this person is or why it is located separate from the Knerr family members, or how she relates to the Knerr family members. I found this on August 25, 1999 and have documented it with a photo. Susan Zacharias, genealogist, was questioned about it and she cannot shed any light on it either. Catherine Allion who married Jacob Knerr is her ancestor also, and she has researched this family extensively.

# Notes for HUGH JOHNSTON KNERR:

Major General Hugh J. Knerr, Retired October 31, 1949, Died November 1, 1971.

Hugh J. Knerr was one of a small group of airpower advocates who helped keep alive and to expand on General "Billy" Mitchell's theories of air warfare. For three years, from 1927 to 1930, he was commanding officer of the 2nd. Bomb Group - and as such, was in general charge of development of bombardment tactics in the Air Corps.

When Air Corps Chief Major General Benjamin D. Foulois asked Lieutenant Colonel "Hap" Arnold to lead a squadron of new B-10's pioneering round-trip flight from Bolling Field to Fairbanks, Alaska, Major Hugh Knerr was assigned as Arnold's executive officer. Between July 19 and August 20, 1934, the two led the 10 B-10's on

their 18,000 mile test during which they photographed some 20,000 square miles of Alaskan territory, providing data that was useful later in World War  $\Pi$ .

As early as 1928 Knerr had recommended development of two new monoplane, multi-engined bombers - one type with high speed, strong firepower and short range, and one long-range bomber, with heavy load capability. The Boeing B-9 and the Martin B-10 and B-12 were outgrowths of these and other requirements as seen by Knerr and other Air Corps professionals.

As the Air Corps' leading expert in bombardment tactics, Knerr had helped develop the requirements list in 1933 that called for future aircraft which would evolve into the B-17 and B-29. And when the first B-17s were declared operational in 1937 they were assigned to General Headquarters Air Force at Langley Field, Va., where Knerr was Chief of Staff.

Under Major General Frank M. Andrews, commanding general of General Headquarters Air Force, Colonel Knerr worked for three years to help build the organization, the aircraft, the trained crews, and the bases required for U.S. airpower. Among the Army, Navy, and Air Corps the competition for funds and mission assignments was keen, and sometimes bitter. In February 1938 Colonel Knerr was assigned as air officer in the 8th. Corps area, Fort Sam Houston, Texas - the same assignment given 13 years before to another crusader for airpower, Brigadier General "Billy" Mitchell.

In March 1939 the War Department virtually put an end to the semi-independent General Headquarters Air Force by reducing General Andrews to the grade of colonel, and reassigning him and his key officers. Colonel Knerr retired that same month, having served more than 30 years.

Knerr achieved national recognition during the next two years for his military articles in leading magazines and his lectures about the need to a separate Air Force,

In 1942 Knerr was recalled to serve as deputy commander of the Air Force's supply and maintenance organization, the Air Service Command, at Washington, D.C. and Patterson Field, Ohio. A year later, General Carl Spaatz, the great wartime leader of the 8th. Air Force, made Brigadier General Knerr his deputy commanding general for administration as well as commander of the 8th. Air Force Service Command. As a result, Knerr exercised theater-wide authority over logistical matters - and supply and maintenance won recognition as a function equal with combat operations.

Knerr became a Major General in March 1944 and was appointed deputy commanding general of U.S. Air Forces, Europe, in June. A year later he was placed in command of Air Technical Service Command, which was reorganized to become the overall material and logistics command for the Air Force.

General Knerr's last three years of service to the Air Force were at the very highest levels. He served on the Joint Strategic Survey Committee in Washington; as special assistant to the commanding general of the Army Air Forces, General Spaatz; as secretary general of the Air Board; and as special assistant to the first secretary of the Air Force, Stuart Symington.

In June 1948 General Knerr became the U.S. Air Force's first inspector general. He retired, for the second time, in October 1949.

Hugh Johnston Knerr was born in Fairfield, Iowa in 1887. He graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1908 and served as an ensign in the Navy from 1908 until 1911, when he transferred to the Army as a second lieutenant. For the next new years he served in various assignments as a mechanical engineer and material officer. He attended the Aviation School at San Diego in 1917.

He was commanding officer of the 88th. Observation Squadron and later the 5th. Division of Air Service at Wilbur Wright Field in Fairfield, Ohio from February 1923 to August 1925. Knerr attended the Air Service Tactical School, the Command and General Staff School, and the Army War College.

Hugh Knerr's great technical knowledge, his command flying experience, his loyalty to his organization, and his dogged determination made him an officer that the Air Force's top leaders - generals Andrews, Arnold and Spaatz - depended on in building and running the air arm of the turbulent thirties and the wartime forties.

(Article current as of Oct. 4, 1968) Most of the material for this article came from Pentagon sites. It appears he was quite a revolutionary for his early times.

Hugh S. Knerr was born in Port Townsend, Washington on 30 April 1913.

His father, Hugh J. Knerr, was a 1908 graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy, who joined the Coastal Artillery in 1911, and in 1917, the Air Service. The elder Knerr would eventually become a Major General and the first Inspector General of the Air Force. Young Hugh Knerr's many homes included California, Tennessee, Ohio, Florida, Washington, D.C., Texas, Virginia, Kansas and Hawaii.

In 1929, Knerr attended the College of William and Mary for pre-engineering studies. In 1930, he entered the U.S. Naval Academy in the Class of 1934, graduating 355 in a class of 464. He then voluntarily resigned his commission to attend one year of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology's naval architecture course, and in 1935, he was hired by Newport News as a Loftsman. In October of that year, he married Sallie E. Frost.

In February 1938, he applied for the U.S. Naval Reserve, but due to professional concerns, he was not accepted until October of 1940. The Navy commissioned Knerr as a Lieutenant (Junior Grade) in November. He was stationed at the Portsmouth Navy Yard...where he worked as the assistant hull Superintendent, responsible for observing sea trials aboard newly constructed submarines.

In June 1942, Knerr was promoted to Lieutenant, USNR, and then to Lieutenant Commander, USNR, in July 1943. He helped supervise the construction of seventy submarines serving as Hull Superintendent and the Progress and Scheduling Officer. At the end of the war, he was appointed Officer-in-Charge of dismantling four surrendered German U-Boats. He was promoted to Commander, USNR in July 1945.

Due to the glut of workers in the post-war civilian shipbuilding industry, Knerr elected to join the Regular Navy in December 1945, as he began a three and a half tour of Shore Division, Bureau of Ships. From February to May 1946, Knerr was sent to Graduate School of Business Administration at Harvard University, where he studied "Advanced Management". In June 1946, Knerr's request to join the Regular Navy was accepted, and he was appointed a Lieutenant (junior grade) as an Engineering Duty Only officer. Half a month later, he started duty as the Head, Management Planning and Review Branch, for the Bureau of Ships. Knerr frequently was given Temporary Assigned Duty in varied locations as part of his job and his connection with the Chief of Naval Operations' On-Site survey in Oahu, Hawaii. Knerr was restored to the rank of Lieutenant Commander in

May 1948. In September 1949, he was assigned to Charleston, South Carolina as the Industrial Engineering Officer. His permanent promotion to full Commander came in May 1950, to rank from 1 January 1950.

After numerous TAD's and assignments, in August 1952, Knerr was reassigned to the U. S. Naval Radiological Defense Laboratory in San Francisco, California as the Industrial Engineering Officer, and in June 1953, he became the Administrative Director (the equivalent of an executive office). In June 1954, Knerr was made the Assistant to the Inspector General in the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations. He frequently surveyed logistic establishments, until he was assigned to Panama Canal Company in April 1956, as the Industrial Division Chief for two-and-a-half years, repairing about a thousand ships a year. In September 1958, he was reassigned to be the Comptroller of the New York Naval Shipyard, but he suffered a major stress-related fever.

Captain Knerr retired in July 1963. He went back to work in 1964 as a Manager and Assistant to the President of the Paulson Engineering Service, Inc., in Charleston, South Carolina. He left Paulson Engineering in 1967, and became a self-employed naval architecture consultant. In 1974-75, he collaborated with the Persian Gulf Shipbuilding Corporation to design the shipyard in Bandar Abbas, Iran.

Captain Knerr died in Charleston on 24 August 1978, after suffering a heart attack. He was buried near his father in Arlington National Cemetery.

January 2003 - JR. (L.T. Knerr, Jr.) told me today he remembers that Noah Fisher lived a short distance from Sarah Anne's home in Maumee when they were growing up. Was this a neighborhood romance? During the operation of the mill one day, Noah was cut across the face by a saw blade in an accident at the mill. OH, and died 08 Feb 1937 in West Toledo, Lucas Co., OH. He married (1) MARY ANN CUMISKEY<sup>8</sup> 08 Apr 1890 in Toledo, Lucas Co., OH, daughter of OWEN CUMISKEY and MARY DAWSON. She was born Nov 1861 in New York, New York, and died 14 Dec 1894 in West Toledo, Lucas Co., OH. He married (2) OLA B. WISNER 1910 in Toledo, Lucas Co., OH, daughter of CORNELIUS WISNER and HATTIE UNKNOWN. She was born Jun 1886 in Michigan, and died 23 Apr 1919 in West Toledo, Lucas Co., OH. He married (3) BERTHA GOERGEN 04 Oct 1924 in Lucas Co., OH, daughter of JOHN GOERGEN and FRANCIS UNKNOWN. She was born 27 May 1874 in Toledo, Lucas Co., Toledo, OH, and died 07 May 1929 in West Toledo, Lucas Co., OH. He met (4) UNKNOWN RICHARDSON Abt. 1935 in Toledo, Lucas Co., OH. She was born Abt. 1887.

# Notes for Charles Frederick Knern:

Larry Knarr a Knerr genealogy researcher of Cincinnati, Ohio, has recorded that Frederick and Bertha Goergen had two daughters born to them, just as Grandma (Cathrine T.) has recorded. Grandma had their names listed as "Ola" and "Bertha". Larry has one name as "Ola M. Knerr", and that she could have been born in 1907. He also has that she married an Ernest Feuerriegil. This is all wrong! Grandma told her daughter-in-law, K. Ladine Knerr in 1936 that Fred married two different ladies after his wife died in 1894. Mother recorded that he married "Ola M." and "Bertha" and that each had died. This is the correct information.

Darla Knerr Kizer April 15, 2007

On the 1870 Census form he is listed as "Charlie". Was his name Charles Frederick or Frederick Charles? We can't document the correct order.

He is buried beside of his daughter, Theresa E. (Knerr) and son-in-law Fred V. Hoskins in the Toledo Memorial Park, Sylvania, Lucas Co., Ohio. Sec. = 14, Lot # 384, near the Sun Dial.

Brothers married sisters. Henry married Catherine Theresa Cumiskey and Frederick C. married her older sister,

Mary Ann Cumiskey. Common in those days.

Information recorded by K. Ladine Knerr in the winter of 1936 in Florida, and is according to Catherine T. (Cumiskey) Knerr.

Mary Ann died in 1894. Cause of death on death certificate is "Septi-Cardia". The word "Septi" means infection in the blood...blood poisoning. Then "Cardia" refers to the heart...Cardiac. So, she died of an infection of her heart muscle after an illness of 10 weeks and being treated by a doctor for this condition.

There is nothing that I could find recorded, of when Frederick married Bertha Goergen. But, Susan Zacharias has it recorded as October 4, 1924 in Lucas Co., Ohio.

When Fred died in 1937 he had a girlfriend. First name unknown, but last name of Richardson.

Further research tells us that "Ola M. Knerr" was not the daughter of Fred and Bertha but was "Ola B. Wisner", the second wife of Fred. She is buried with her parents, C.D. Wisner's, on the Wisner family plot. I took a day trip to Eaton Rapids, Michigan, and some questions were answered. Ola B. Wisner, second wife of Fred Knerr, was buried in the family plot. A visit to the gravesites of Ola and her parents cleared up this incorrect information and I have recorded the site in a photo.

Jim Gilsdorf, Jr. January 24, 2004

Fred Knerr died February 8, 1937 (Toledo Blade Obituary Feb. 9, 1937) and yes, he had two daughters by his second marriage. I forgot about them. They were not living when I was a boy. I think they died in Infancy. We need to check this at the Library. (Editor: I think this got confused years ago. No record can be found that Fred and Ola M. Knerr had two daughters who died in infancy named "Ola" and "Bertha". According to Catherine Cumiskey Knerr (1936) he had two wives by those names. He had no other children by his second wife, Ola M. Knerr and his third wife, Bertha Goergen Knerr.)

Gramma (Theresa E. (Knerr) Hoskins) was the executor to the will for the Aunts (Emma and Louise Knerr). The property that Jacob left to them on Heatherdowns and Key Street, was sold in 1969, I think. Gramma wanted me to buy it in 1968, but by that time the property was down to a big city lot and an old house. I was going to offer \$12,000.00 for it. then the U.S. sent me my greeting and salutations and I was off to Viet Nam. The Aunts were too strong in their Lutheran faith to sell to the Catholic Church even though "St. Patricks of Heatherdowns" made several offers to buy. Emma and Louise, the Aunts, always refused each one of their offers.

Darla, your Uncle Leroy and Aunt Mary, Uncle Ray and Aunt Della Knerr lived on Giant Street. Gramma and me did a lot of things out there. Gramma's knees were bad but she could still drive. We would go out and do chores for Emma and Louise. I would chop wood for the stove; cut the grass in the rock infested yard. I remember I would go across the road to the Marathon station, one block west of the house to buy gas for the mower. Grandma told me it used to be owned by one of her cousins. (This cousin would have been Henry G. and Catherine (Cumiskey) Knerr.)

The farm was on Eastgate and Heatherdowns Road. It was quite large at one time. The (Old Maid) Aunts never worked: just had their garden and sold eggs out of the chicken coop. As they needed money for the daily existence they would sell off parcels of land to developers. As the civilized world moved closer to their 1800 existence, the neighbors would petition them to start removing the Barn, Corn Crib, Chicken Coop, and finally the Outhouse. That is probably where Leroy (Sr.) made out putting the hot water tank in the kitchen and the bathroom in the corner closet. The Outhouse didn't go that fast though. If I remember correctly they didn't like the bathroom. I know they gave a lot of money to the (St. Pauls) Lutheran Church in Maumee. I think a whole wing worth, not sure, but my sister is a member there and is trying to find out how they are remembered.

My brother had a copy of the will. Why is another story, but it listed 21 cousins that received checks from the estate. Like I said before, I was in Viet Nam when all of this took place and have no first hand knowledge of this period of time. The lawyer got a good chunk also. Mainly because of all the deaths and research that had to be done. Since it was left to all the nieces and nephews except Mary and Theresa. The will is on record at the Lucas

County Probate Court, probated around 1969.

I hope that I haven't lead you astray on the old farm. The Catholic Church DID NOT BUY IT! I don't know who did but it is a bank today. They tore off the second floor and the front parlor. What a shame about the second floor. The roof rafters were real tree trunks. Always amazed me when I would see them. The bank sits on the original foundation. Just last year (2004) they cut down the big Blue Spruce that probably my grandmother (Theresa) and the rest of the family planted out in front of the house in 1903, when it was built. The family lived in the barn loft before that (while the house was being built). Can't imagine sharing the bed with a horse!



# Notes for MARY ANN CUMISKEY:

U.S.Federal Census of 1870 shows the family living in Ellington, Tolland County, Conn. Stafford Springs is their Post Office Address. This was taken in June 1870 and lists her place of birth as New York and her age as 9 years. So, she must have had her birthday in the first half of the year of 1870. It also lists her brother, Eugene as being 5/12 which means he was five months of age. In one of the columns the enumerator has written the month of "Dec". Does this mean he was born in December of 1869? On his death certificate the informant is his Niece, Elsie (Cumiskey) Volk, and she lists his birthday as "Dec. 15, 1871". Evidently she gave the wrong year of his birth, because we know he was already born, and was five months of age by the time the census of 1870 was taken in June 1870.



I know that all of the records, and contacts with, the people at the Catholic Archives at Calvary Cemetery told us that there never was a cemetery at the St. Francis de Sales church property near the Maumee River in downtown Toledo. However, in conversation one day with a worker at the Calvary Cemetery, he told us that indeed there was a cemetery on that property and that at one time the caskets were moved from that site to Mt. Carmel. He said the persons were all put into one common grave but the headstones were saved. He did not know where those headstones were put.

One other story we read, during our research at the Toledo Library, documented that when a large nearby company needed space for their business and wanted to expand, they negotiated a price for the cemetery land, with the leaders of the church. They then purchased the property upon which the cemetery was located. The article said that is when the graves were relocated to Mt. Carmel and placed in one common grave.

Notes for HENRY GEORGE KNERR:

Mary Ann and Catherine Theresa Cumiskey, sisters married brothers, Frederick Charles and Henry George Knerr, sons of Jacob and Catherine (Allion) Knerr.

Henry and Catherine met at a barn dance, very popular in those days; not necessarily held in a barn! He was a fiddler and she a good dancer. Occassionally they got to dance together, which eventually led to marriage in June 1890.

Henry and Frederick were both excellent violin players and loved to play together. Doing so whenever asked. A grandaughter, Penny Knerr Bullock owns the Violin that Henry played in the 1880's and early 1900's.

There is a studio photo taken of the two brothers and two unnamed men with their instruments. It was given to Susan Zacharias of Swanton, Ohio, by her Aunt Helen (Zacharias) Fisher prior to the Aunt's death. Bernard Utz and his wife also have an original photo of this same group. James K. Knerr and Darla Yancey both have copies of the photo. (See photo section of this book for photo).

Henry George, Julia Amelia, Louis, Emma R., Louise Ellen Knerr are all buried in the Wakeman Cemetery, Waterville, Lucas County, Ohio. They are all on the Knerr family plot allong with their parents JACOB AND CATHERINE (ALLION) KNERR.

Family lore tells that ecause Louise E. and Emma R. (the old maid sister's) did not like Catherine Theresa they refused to permit her to be buried beside of her husband on the family plot. Since Emma and Louise outlived Catherine Theresa, they were in possession of the remaing lots. Together they put pressure on the family to bury Catherine Theresa else where. So, she is buried a short distance away on a plot owned by the youngest son, Marion Eugene Knerr, Sr. The real reason may be that there were only two more lots left on the family plot and Emma and Louise both wanted those two lots for themselves. The family plot has 8 burial lots, but the sexton says that the large family headstone may have taken up the other two lots, thus making only six lots available for burials.

Buried beside of Catherine T. Knerr is her grandaughter, Kathy Lynn Taylor who died at the age of 6 from Leukemia. Also, buried on that same plot are Kathy's parents; James A. and Audrey Lavon (Knerr) Taylor. These are all buried on the lots owned by Marion Knerr. There are four other lots on that same family plot and

purchased by Leroy T. Knerr, Sr. In 2007 these four lots are now owned by Bruce Knerr, a grandson.

Buried nearby is the Heinrich Knarr family, the Lewis Knerr family, Vern Knarr and his wife, and the John Utz family. All direct Knerr family members. Also buried in this cemetery are other Knerr family relatives.

Darla Knerr Kizer January 2001

In about 1930 they owned and operated a gas station and small grocery store on the corner of Heatherdowns and Key Street. One day some robbers came into the store and robbed them, then took them hostage. The robbers took them into the field out back of the store where they held them for a period of time overnight. Grandma cried and cried so much that the robbers finally got tired of her crying and let them go. After that the sons put a peep-hole into the door going into the storage room from the store, so they could observe who came into the store. The sons took turns standing guard, watching through the peep-hole, with a shotgun by their side. They were prepared to use it if that became necessary, but the robbers never returned.

JR said that on one hot Sunday afternoon when the family was all at Grandpa and Grandma's house in Maumee, some of the grandsons (JR, Rich, Rayme, Fritz, and a couple of others) were arguing and fighting among themselves at his house. They came into the house and wanted something cold to drink. But, there was nothing there, so Grandpa went down to the store and brought back a keg of COLD BEER for them to drink. They were all teen-agers, and under age to drink, but he let them have it. None of them got drunk, but they did stop their arguing and fighting!

Grandpa was a jolly man who loved children and spent lots of time with his grandchildren.

### Notes for CATHERINE THERESA CUMISKEY:

In the recorded account given by her to K.Ladine Knerr, during the mid-1930's, she said that she moved to Toledo with her parents from Connecticut when she was three years of age. In the 1930 Federal Census report it erroneously gives her birthplace as Providence, R.I. She was not born there, but instead was born in Ellington, Tolland County, Conn., as were her brothers Thomas and Eugene and sister Elizabeth (Lizzie) Jane. Her sister, Mary Ann Cumiskey, who married Frederick Charles Knerr was not born in Rhode Island, but in New York. Henry and Frederick were brothers, who married sisters, which was quite common in those days. In some places the Surname is spelled with two "m's" and sometimes it is spelled with an "o" instead of a "u". Sometimes in Ireland it is spelled "MacCumishleigh". But, in my research in Ireland I have found it spelled as it is written here.

I wonder if they are any relation to the person that "Cumiskey Park" the baseball field in Chicago is named for? On I-65 in Kentucky there is also a "Cumiskey Pike". This is a main thoroughfare that crosses I-65. That seems to be a popular name. There is also a famous Orchestra leader with the surname of Cumiskey, but we have not

been able to document any relation to him.

I do not know if Catherine or any of her family were musical, but Henry and Fred Knerr both were. Both played violin's and were highly sought after to play at Barn Dances in the late 1880's and early 1890's. We have a photo of them, taken around the late 1880's with two other young unidentified men who are holding instruments also.

Catherine is not buried on the Knerr family plot in the Wakeman Cemetery. Family lore is that the two single sisters did not like her and refused to permit her to be buried there beside of her husband, Henry George. So she is buried a short distance away on a family plot owned by a son, Marion Eugene Knerr. Also buried on that same family plot is a grandaughter, Audrey Knerr Taylor, Audrey's husband, James A. Taylor and a great grandaughter, Kathy Lynn Taylor. Kathy Lynn (8 yrs.) died of Leukemia. There is no inscription on the headstone for Audrey and her husband, James. It is Lot # 160, 3rd. Edition of the cemetery. Audrey was close to her grandparents due to the fact that her mother, Dorothy Carlton, was killed in a train/auto wreck when Audrey was about one year of age. So, she grew up in her grandparents home, spending much of the time there, even after her father remarried in 1927 to Fern Battershell of Hicksville, Defiance Co., Ohio. Marion purchased the East 1/2 of the 8 lot family plot and the West 1/2 was purchased by Leroy T. Knerr, Sr., and is still owned in 2008 by his descendants.

Could it be that the two single sisters didn't want Catherine buried beside of Henry so they could save the final lots for themselves. Buried on the KNERR family plot are Jacob and Catherine (Allion) Knerr, Henry George Knerr, Emma R. Knerr, Louise Ellen Knerr, and Julia Knerr Moore. But, that would only be six persons and there are eight lots in the plot. Sexton at the Wakeman Cemetery said he believes the reason that Catherine was not buried beside of Henry, her husband, is that the family stone in the middle of the plot is large and he thinks that possibly the stone took up two of the spaces.

### Notes for HAROLD LAURENCE "CAL" CALLAHAN:

January 10, 2003 - At the time that Uncle Cal and Aunt Betty were married his parents were employed as the "Bridge Tenders" of the drawbridge linking the mainland to the offshore islands and beaches of Brevard County at Melbourne. # Notes for JOHN KNERR:

His father and brothers all loved to fish, and fished in the Maumee River, and lakes in Ohio. He fished in Sarasota Bay after moving to Florida. His favorite place to fish in Florida was from the John Ringling Bridge that spanned the bay, linking the mainland to the offshore island of St. Armands Key. Fishing during the 1940's was excellent so he seldom came home without a string of fish. Among them would be his favorite fish, the Pompano. This was a sweet, mild flavored fish.

During the winter when his father and/or brothers were in Florida they would always go fishing together. Someone in the family always brought our grandparents down to spend the winter with us during the late 1930's. In the Spring some would come down and take them back to Toledo. After Grandpa died, as the result of a stroke, Grandma didn't come anymore. Genevieve (Penny Knerr) Bullock remembers that Grandpa was a jolly, happy man who loved children. Other cousins, also, remember him this way. They remember Grandma with less affection; she had a stern, hot-tempered personality. One said she had a "short fuse" and gave Grandpa a lot of grief and problems.

He was always pleasant to be around and was soft-spoken. He had a caring and giving personality that never wanted to see anyone suffer, or do anyone any harm and he never held a grudge, that we can remember. He possessed a "Photographic Memory". Never owned his own business but was always popular with his co-workers and well liked by his employers. During WWII he worked two jobs. One was his bakery job where he went at 3:00 a.m. to bake the bread that he had set the yeast for the afternoon before. His second job during the war years was working at the Commissory on the Sarasota Air Force Base. The base was about a mile north of our house. When he completed his job at the Base he would go directly to the Bakery in the afternoon to set his yeast for the next days baking and then come home around 5:30 to 5:45 p.m., in time for supper which was always served at 6:00 p.m. Because of the need to rise early he was always in bed by 8:00 or 9:00 p.m.

His two vices were smoking cigarettes and drinking beer every Saturday night while playing cards with friends. He also loved Limberger cheese on crackers. Mother always kept the cheese closed up tightly in a glass jar in the refrigerator, so the other foods in the fridge would not pick up the odor of the cheese. She always said it smelled like something that died and she could not understand how Dad could eat it! He spoke some German at times, but never taught it to us children. Or maybe the reason was that we didn't show any interest in learning it! I do remember hearing him say "Geseundheit" when we would sneeze or "Danke Shan" for thank you when we handed something to him.

He told me that his father's family had immigrated from Alsace/Loraine section of France. Today Salzberg is the capital of that district. The Alsace/Loraine area was made a part of France at one time in the early 1900's and later it became part of Germany. Today it again has become a part of France. His mother's family had immigrated from Ireland, but I don't know what part of the country they came from because he never talked about that side of the family. Nor, do I know what they did for a living prior to coming here just before 1860. Perhaps it was during the Potato famine that gripped Ireland during those years. I don't know but am just speculating due to the time in history when they came and what was transpiring in that country during those years. In my research of that family I have now learned that they sailed from County Cork, Ireland coming into New York City. Later they moved to Connecticut where he worked in a "cotton batting factory". Grandma was born in May 6, 1873 and she said that in 1876 the family moved to Toledo, Ohio where they lived on a small farm in the West Toledo area.

Dad said he had to quit school in the 6th, grade and go to work (that would be in about the year of 1902), in order to help support the family as there were 5 other siblings in the family by then. He never seemed angry or bitter about it, just stated it as a fact of his life. His vocational jobs were at various times: charter and/or city bus driver, truck driver, Nursery employee, Florist, baker, salesman, and taxi driver. His first job in 1902 at 11 years of age was as an elevator operator in one of the tall downtown buildings.

Dad loved to work with wood and made many projects, not the least of which, was the two story house he built for us in 1938-39 on Myrtle Street in Sarasota. It had two rooms (living room and small kitchen) and a garage downstairs, while upstairs there were two large rooms for sleeping and a large walk-in closet. In 1940 he added a large kitchen and bathroom on the back of the house. Fourteen years after Dad died, Mother remarried and she then rented the house to another family while she and Mitch lived in Ft. Myers, Florida, where Mitch worked for the Florida Power and Light Co., prior to his retirement. During that time the house Dad built caught fire and burned to the ground.

### Notes for FLORENCE ELIZABETH MIDDAUGH:

Leroy T. Knerr, Jr. (called JR) told me that there were three of the Bohm brothers. They grew up in Toledo near where the Knerr family lived. One of the brothers, Ollie, was an alcoholic. In the years when the cars used alcohol in the engines he would go out to the cars, lay on the ground beneath the vehicle and open the petcock on the engine and let the alcohol run into his mouth, when he couldn't get it any other way.

JR said that the family lived on Cone Street in Toledo at one time. (In 1930-34 they lived at 1923 Cone St.) One time my Mother told me that before they met, while John and Florence were still married in the 1920's that Florence and John lived in a boarding house. He drove City Bus and she managed the Boarding house. They had two children, Dorothy May and Robert "Bobby" John Knerr. One day when Dad came home from work he found Florence in a passionate embrace with one of their roomers. That man's name was Mr. Albert Bohm. Florence told John that she wanted a divorce; she was awarded one and then married Mr. Bohm. Mother said that the two children were living with their mother, but John had visitation rights and had to pay support for them. At some time my Mother met the two children during the days she dated my Father. He was to take the support money to the house to give to Florence. Mother said that a few years later they learned that the children were using the surname of Bohm, but Mother did not know if they had ever been adopted by Mr. Bohm. {2007 no record can be found to support that claim.}

The 1930 U.S. Census lists Albert and Florence Bohm. They were living at 1923 Cone St. Toledo. Robert J. Knerr is listed as a step-son and Dorothy Mae Knerr is listed as a step-daughter of Mr. Bohm.

On the marriage certificate dated December 14, 1928 for Albert E. Bohm and Florence E. (Middaugh) Knerr her address is listed as 1614 Nevada in Toledo, Ohio, that is rather strange as that was just the bare lot that Dad had purchased in the early 1920's, and prior to the divorce, where he planned to build them a house. But no house was on the lot yet then. She requested and received that lot in the divorce settlement.

# Notes for KATHRINE LADINE COLE:

Mother was an excellent cook and seamstress. She loved to cook but did not entertain often. As a child I remember going to some of their friends house on Saturday nights where the adults played cards and we ate sandwiches there for supper. Mother made a great sandwich spread of well done bacon strips that were crumbled

into liverwurst and some salad dressing added to make the spread. I'm sure it was fattening, high in cholesterol fat and not what Dad should have been eating, but as children we didn't worry about that. We just loved to eat the spread.

When she would frost a cake and have frosting left she would spread it between two graham crackers for us, and we would gobble them up fast. Those were our "cookies" for snack time. Mom always made a batch of cookies each week for us to nibble on. We attacked the "cookie jar" on our way out to play after school.

We purchased our lunch in the school cafeteria and that is where I learned to like "blackeyed peas". This was a southern delicacy and always cooked with a piece of ham, or a ham hock, to flavor them. I don't remember my Mother ever making them at home. Most of her cooking was German or Irish type dishes learned at home from her Mother or Mother-in-law. During the war years we always had a "Victory Garden" in the side yard or next door on Uncle Leroy's lot. We raised tomatoes, leaf lettuce, red radishes, green onions and we also had citrus fruit from the Orange and Grapefruit trees in our yard. Mother made our jam from Guava's (a southern fruit) and elderberries that we picked each summer.

When she made a ple she always rolled the leftover crust out, spread butter on it, sprinkled sugar and cinnamon over it, rolled it into a roll and cut it into small round cinnamon rolls, placing them on cookie sheets and baked them in the oven until slightly brown. Those did not last very long after coming out of the oven either! We devoured them. MMM good!

Her elderberry pies in the late summer were mouth watering. So tasty and food to die for! Those were always ready to go on the table for our family when we arrived home from church on Sunday at noon. My favorite Sunday dinner was beef roast, served with oven roasted potatoes (or mashed potatoes), carrots and always an onion in the roaster. This was all prepared in her cast iron Dutch Oven and was always served with Dad's home made bread, that he made and baked at his job at "Farwell's Bakery".

She made all of my clothes until I was a teen-ager. I had some beautiful clothes that she made, I remember one she made when I was about 11 or 12. It was a lavender taffeta housecoat with pink bows on the front. I always wore it Saturday afternoon following my weekly bath in the wash tub! I remember the Christmas that I received my first "purchased" piece of clothing. It was wrapped in a box and waiting for me under the tree! I was thrilled! It was a plain pink, cotton blouse with white buttons down the front. I thought I was something really special to have a "bought" blouse!

I remember one time during the War Years (1941-1945) when many of the girls at school were wearing gathered skirts made from purchased material which was printed fabric in the design of a quilt. We could not afford to buy the fabric so Mother lovingly and carefully sewed together pieces she had left in her "scrap bag" to make me one. These pieces were left over fabric from other sewing projects. She matched and coordinated the colors of fabric. The pieces were cut into different sizes and shapes and then sewed together in a crazy quilt pattern to make the skirt. The skirt was gorgeous. But, being young, I did not appreciate the hours of work that went into the project and was ashamed to wear the skirt to school. Today I am ashamed of my attitude and wish I had that skirt today, or even a photo of it, but unfortunately I don't.

Mother patched our clothes when we played hard and got holes in them. That was accepted in those days. Mothers were to keep our clothes clean and well mended. I remember one time when my brothers were fussing because they had to wear jeans that had patches on the knees where they had wom holes into them, either falling down, or from being on their knees shooting marbles. Mother told them that, "... patches are not a disgrace but holes are"!

During the Depression years, the WWII years and shortly after that, she used to sit in the evenings with her darning box on her lap and darn our family members socks, while Dad would listen to the radio and get the war reports. She had a round wooden shaped object that was called a "darner". She slipped it into the sock; going down to the toes or heels, and then proceeded to stitch the hole closed in smooth back and forth fashioned stitches so it did not make blisters on our feet when we wore them. Clothes were hard to get during the war years, due to rationing, so this was one way of extending the life of clothes that we owned. If they got too small for us children, they were passed down to the next in line.

One time I remember taking some money (several dimes and a couple of quarters) out of my father's pants pocket one day to buy ice cream for all of my friends the next day at school. At first, when confronted, I denied it, but my father knew it had to be me as I was the only one of the children with money to spend that day. Finally, I admitted it to him and I never stole anything again after that. My Dad was so disappointed in me that it made my punishment even worse. I wasn't spanked for it but I was sternly talked to and I did have to sit on my bed, upstairs and all by myself, for a long time to ponder it, and that was even worse punishment. I never wanted to take something that wasn't mine, or disappoint my Dad, like that ever again.

I vivedly remember the last time that I saw my Father alive. It was his day off from driving Taxi in Sarasota. He had been to the dentists in Bradenton and stopped by to visit us at our house in Oneco. Kathie, our first child

and his first grandchild, was eight months old and playing on the floor in the kitchen while I was cooking. It was cool that day, in mid-December, and he picked her up off of the floor and was holding her while he talked with Lester and I. He didn't stay long as we were preparing to go away somewhere, but he said he would stop the next week again to see us. We parted and two evenings later Mother brought the news that he had died that day of a heart attack. He had suffered several of them in the previous year.

He suffered with Angina Pectoris at times and took Nitroglyerin tablets to relieve the pain. This one had occurred in the pre-dawn hours and Mother had given him a Nitro and he went back to sleep after the pain subsided. He seldom went to work on the days that he suffered the Angina. Mother went on to work that day and Harold and Donald both went on to school. When Mother came home from work in the late afternoon, she found his Plymouth car still parked in the driveway. Thinking it strange she had the neighbor man go up to check on Dad, who found him dead. The coroner said he had died several hours earlier in the day. He apparently had suffered another heart attack later that morning which was fatal. He was 59 years 3 mos and 9 days of age. Some of our Aunts and Uncles came for the funeral from Toledo and Melbourne. He was buried on December 20, 1950 in Manasota Memorial Park, Oneco, FL.

# Notes for ROBERT JOHN KNERR:

During a phone conversation with Bobby in 1999 he told me that he never knew who his biological father was and never asked. He said he was always told that he was adopted. He said he must have been about 3-4 years of age when the adoption took place as he always knew that fact and never questioned his parents regarding it. (One place in my notes following my first phone conversation with him he told me that he was adopted in 1930). I asked him when he was born and he told me November 28, 1923. Wow! I told him that mine was November 24, 1930. We almost share the same da

In 2002, a meeting in Texas between Bobby and my two brothers, Harold and James was attempted, but was not successful. During the phone conversation with his wife, Sybil, who answered the phone, Bobby came back home from walking their dog and she ended the conversation abruptly. Since he could be heard in the

background, very agitated and angry, it is assumed that she did not get the phone hung up ,(it sounded like she tried to hang the phone up, but it did not cut the line) and his angry voice was heard, with expletive language being used. No further contacts have been made with him. My brothers and I simply wanted to meet him and his wife, but he did not wish for us to do so.

In searching for his birth on the Lucas County Birth Records no birth for him can be found. However, on the page where it should be listed for the year 1923 the book is bound so tightly that all of the surnames cannot be read completely....the first two letters of the surname is in the binding. Where his should be listed in the "KN" there is one birth record recorded, that of Knerr, Marjorie Lois 10.04.23. She is the daughter of Leroy T. and Mary (Reichler) Knerr, Sr. She and Robert were the only Knerr children born in 1923 that can be found. Beneath Marjorie's record the next name is blackened out and unreadable. However, by studying the blacked out area it soon becomes apparent that the name can be partially read by holding the paper up to a bright light. This name looks like Knerr, Robert John and the date is 11.2\_\_.23. the next number after the "2" for the day is not deciperable. So it appears that this is his recorded birth. Was his birth blacked out in order to change his name from Robert John Knerr to Robert James Knerr? Why was it blacked out? The birth of Dorothy Mae Knerr is not blacked out when she was born on August 17, 1917. No record has been located as of this date showing that these children were ever adopted.

In reading the court records procurred from the Lucas County Court House I find the divorce filing. Florence E. Knerr, plaintiff vs. John Knerr, defendant. In these papers the wife asks for complete custody of the two children. These children are listed as Dorothy Mae Knerr, aged ten years and Robert John Knerr, aged 4 years. The divorce papers were filed on March 23, 1928 and the divorce decree was made final on May 5, 1928.

On May 3, 1928 there is a document filed in the Lucas County Court by the attorneys of John Knerr, defendant. The motion is a request to "....further move the court for an order giving this defendant the care and custody of the two minor children now in custody of the plaintiff."

This documents that the two minor children were not abandoned by their father, as related by one researcher, but became pawns in the divorce proceedings filed by Florence E. Knerr, vs John Knerr the defendant.

All of the cousins that I have talked with have related how miserable Florence made life for John, her husband, during the marriage. Her accusations in the divorce papers and court filings reveal her darker side. No one remembers her with any sympathy or kindness. All do remember her as being a "social climber" who wanted expensive clothing, furniture and gifts. She had "champagne tastes on a beer pocket book" is how one cousin related it. She had a beautiful face.

Was Bobby's name blocked out of the birth record book in order to change his middle name from "John" to "James" at the time of the divorce? It could not have been done at the time when his mother married Mr. Bohn because they were not married until December 23, 1928. Bobby's statement to me in our first phone conversation in 1999 that he thought that he was "adopted" in 1930, is incorrect. John Knerr had filed for custody of the two children in May 1928 and would never have signed any papers allowing his parental rights to be severed, which is necessary in order for the adoption of a biological child to be adopted by a future parent.

Interestingly enough that he was only 60 miles from his biological father and never knew it. It's strange that this has happened in other adoption cases that I know of. The adoptee learns they are only a short distance from the biological parent but has no contact or knowledge of that fact, sometimes until later.

Sybil said she sings with Bobby in clubs in Ft. Worth and works with him in his music shop there.

Aunt Jean's actual birthday was August 6, 1894, but it was celebrated on August 18, 1894. This was written in the book owned by Rayme Dickinson in which he kept vital statistics for family members. On Rayme's death the book passed to his sons; David and Terry Dickinson who still have possession of it. Since the death of David Dickinson on October 2, 2005, this book now is in the possession of Terry Dickinson, who now lives in retirement in Ft. Collins, Colorado

Aunt Jean worked for years at LaSalle's Department store in Toledo to help support her children. As a saleslady she received discounts on her purchases. Norma Fretz-Moon remembers that Aunt Jean used to bring hair bows to her sister, Vera Fretz, but never one time did Aunt Jean ever give any to Norma. Aunt Jean raised a family of all boys except for one girl, Virginia Sue, so I suppose she enjoyed seeing the hair bows on her sister Mary T.'s girl. Mary T. had four girls and one boy. Strange why she singled out one girl to give gifts to and ignored the others.

Aunt Jean and Uncle Cecil came to Florida to visit my parents in the Spring of 1940 and when they returned to Ohio they brought me to their home in Toledo with them for a summer visit. We rode the Greyhound bus. I was so privileged to have the time with my father's family and to learn to know my cousins. Many of whom were older than I was but those near my age, and not married, I became close with over the months. I spent a lot of time with my Aunt Mary Knerr, who lived nearby on Glendale Avenue. Aunt Jean's house was on South Detroit Avenue and I would get the bus at the corner, ride it to Glendale and get off and walk to my Aunts house and spend the day. We had so much fun together. I remember they had a Rose Arbor in the back yard and I would sit out there under it and smell the roses. I remember smelling the sweet smell of the Lilac bushes growing at the front steps of Aunt Mary Fretz' house, too.

I remember it was so hot that summer, and no air conditioning, so the Fretz girls and I would take our blankets and pillows downstairs and sleep on the floor under the fans. I traveled all over the city of Toledo during that summer on the buses. I was never afraid to do so. One week-end I went with some family friends to the beach at Lake Erie. We stayed in a cabin there and had a good time swimming and playing in the water. In the late summer Aunt Jean took me back to Florida on the Greyhound bus. One time we had a long overnight wait where we had to change buses in Lake City, Fla (just south of the Fla/GA line) and I remember looking at the clock, hour after hour, and thinking how slow it moved. Our wait was an 8 hour one and seemed so long to a 9 year old! It was such a wonderful gift that they gave to me and one I have always cherished.
