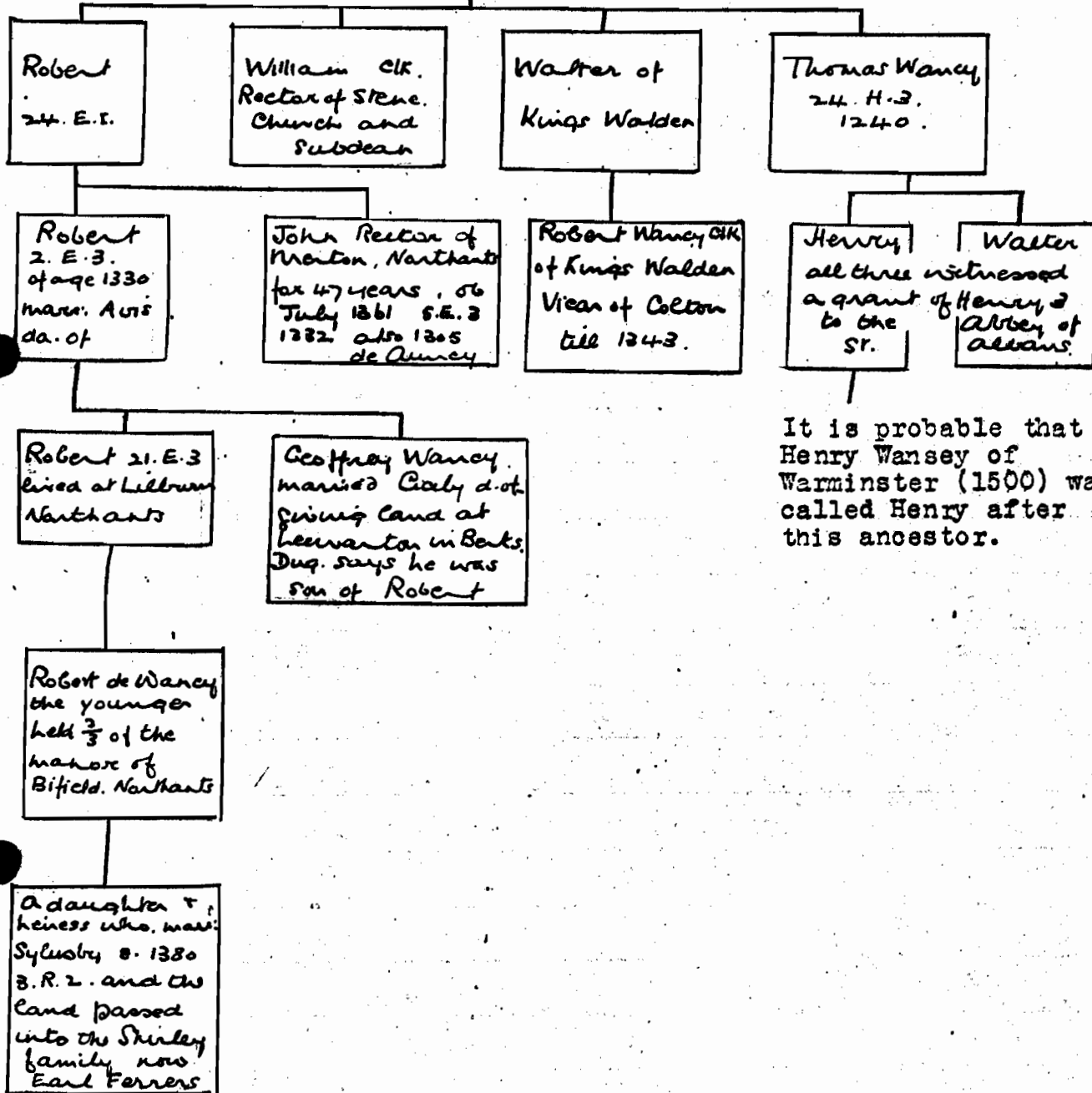


Arms of the Gournays & Wauncis

Line of the Wauncys of Northamptonshire - attached to the Baron Pinkerys

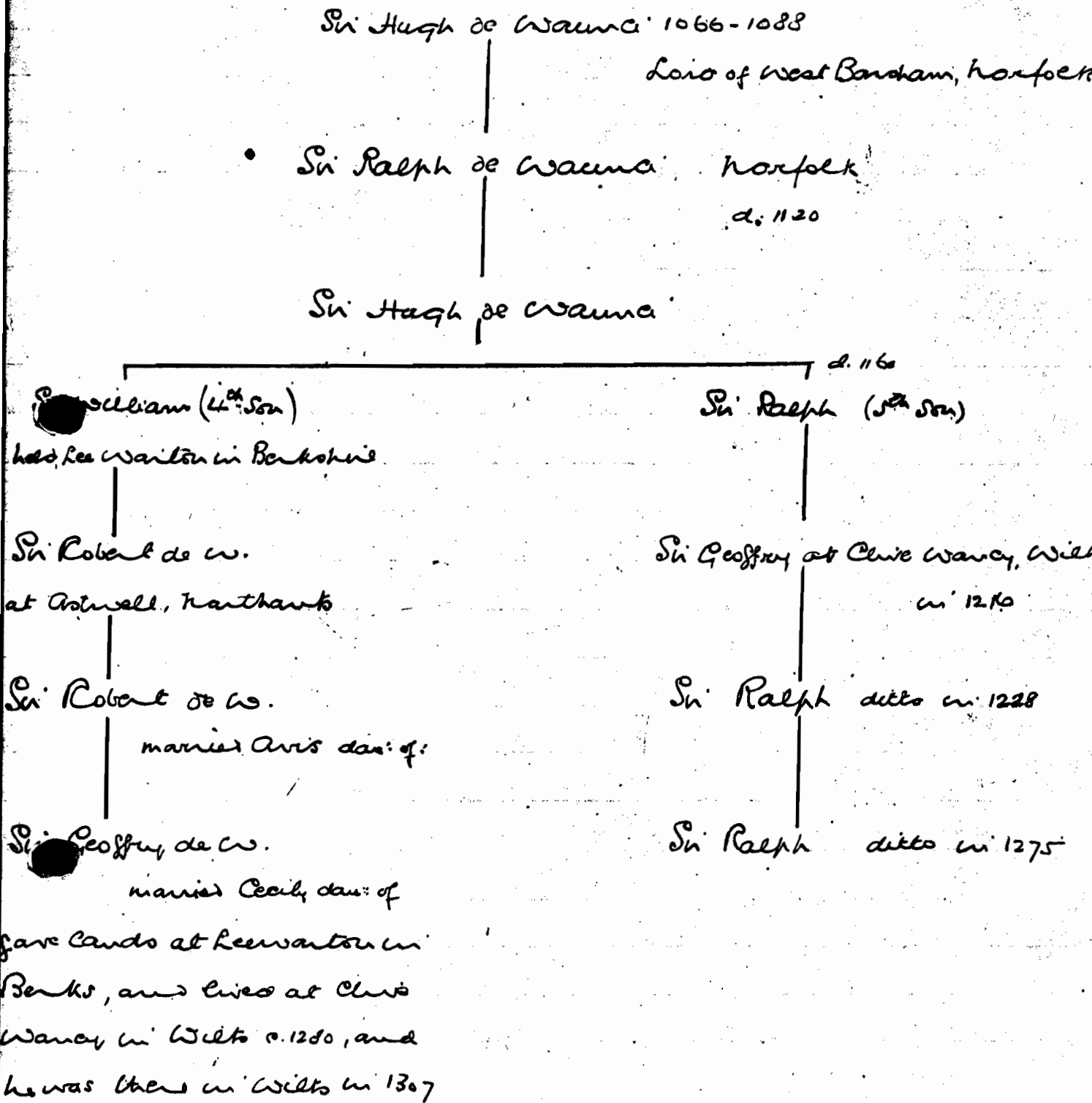
Robert de Wauncy  
 son of William, under the  
 patronage of Baron Pinkerys  
 settled at Astwell  
 which had belonged  
 to Pinkerys 20. H. 2.  
 1236

Lord of several manors in N' thant  
 Astwell, Liburn, Bifield, Wedon,  
 witnessed a deed of lands given  
 by Richard the beloved son of  
 Gilbert de Clare, whose mother  
 was Matilda de Burgh dau. of  
 John de Burgh.

Robert de Waunci at Compton in 1306 and at Salisbury (Wilts) was almost certainly a "Robert of this branch of our family" also John Waunci in 1375.

Henry Wansey of Warminster 1500 must have been called "Henry" after Henry Wansey the grandson of Sir Robert.
