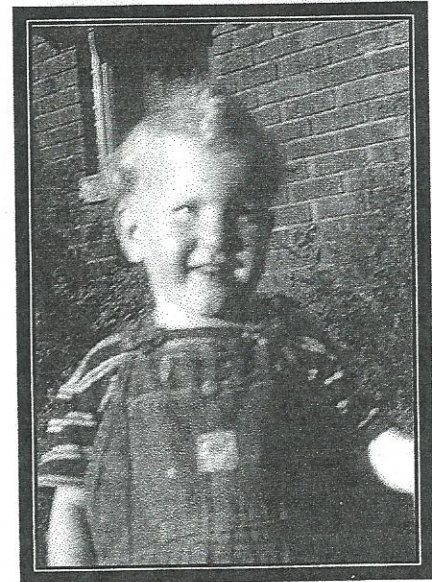
Mother's toombstone

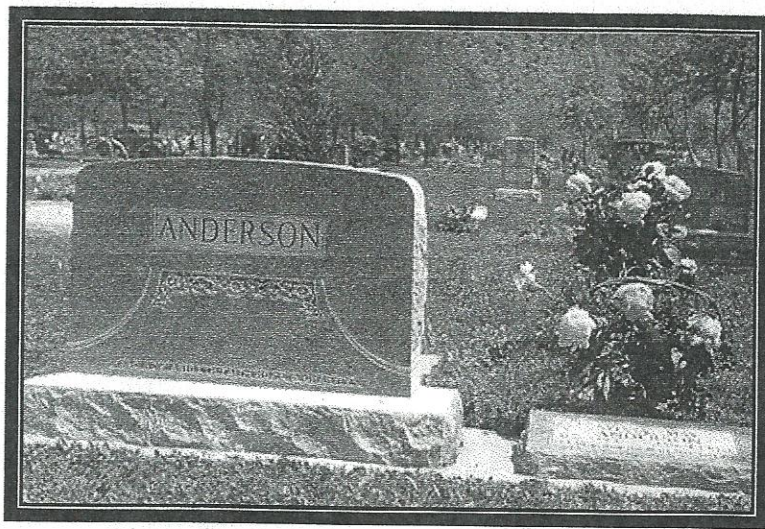
All my brothers with Dad.

The Boldest were in the war (Melvin-Mary) but didn't get in action (Gale-Boldest in Tank)



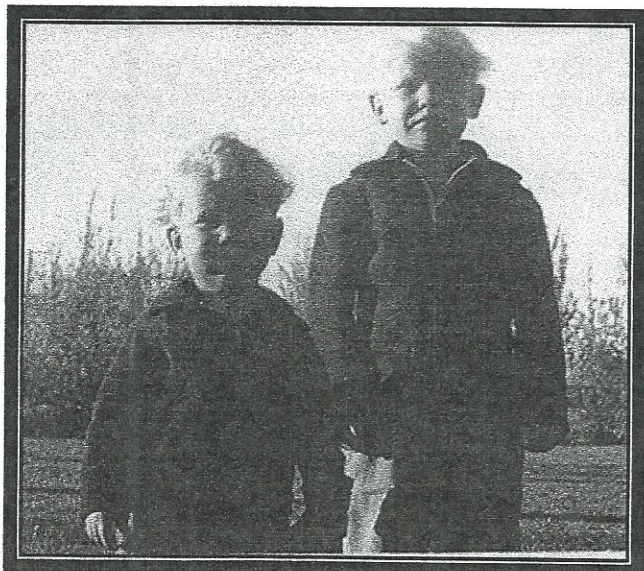
**This picture was probably taken in 1928 or 1929. Left to right Melvin, Mother, Mark, Dad, Paul, and Alice Mae at the back.**



Mother's toombstone

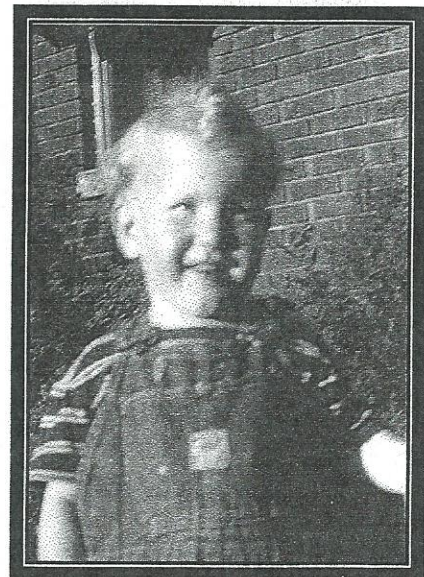
